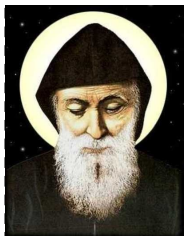

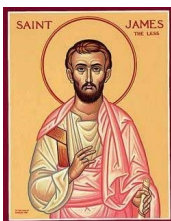




Saints of the week

St. Charbel 24th July Born in 1828 Joseph Makhlof at Beqa-Kafra, Lebanon. His peasant family lived a strong faith. At the age of twenty-three, Charbel (the name he chose when entering the monastery) he enter the Lebanese-Maronite Monastery. Following studies and profession he was ordained in 1859. For the next seven years, Charbel lived in the mountainous community of d'Anaya. After that he spent the next twenty-three years in complete solitude at Sts. Peter and Paul Hermitage near d'Anaya. He died there on Christmas Eve, 1898. Charbel lived a life of austerity, penances, obedience, and chastity. He was beatified in 1965 and canonized in 1977 by Pope Paul VI.

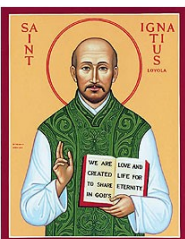
Sts. Joachim and Anne. Friday 26th Traditionally named parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary. St. Anne is patron of Canada, women in labour, miners, cabinet makers, and home makers.



St. James Thursday 25th Son of Zebedee and brother of John, called the Greater. He was put to death by Herod Agrippa about the year 44, being the first of the Apostles to die for Christ. His shrine is at Compostella in Spain

St. Martha c. 1st Century AD

July 29th Sister of Lazarus and Mary, is a woman of faith who made her profession of faith in Christ as the Son of God, and in the resurrection. In welcoming a guest we welcome Christ; we show our Christian spirit of service; and we ready ourselves to be welcomed as guests in the Kingdom of God. Patron of innkeepers, cooks and dieticians.



St. Peter Chrysologus d. 450 July 30th Arch-Bishop of Ravenna, famous for his preaching and public works. He worked actively against the spread of abuses in the Church and the continuance of paganism.
