

Saints of the week

St. Eugene Patron of the diocese of Derry. August 23rd 6th cent. Was the founder of the monastery of Ardstraw, County Tyrone. He was said to have been taken by pirates to Britain. On obtaining his freedom he went to study at Candida Casa. Returning to Ireland he founded Kilnamanagh Monastery in the Wicklow hills, but his principal monastery was at Ardstraw. The Cathedral in Derry is named after him. The diocese covers the most of Derry and Tyrone and the Inishowen peninsula.

St. Rose of Lima, 1586-1617, August 23rd Dominican tertiary and recluse, helped the poor and marginalised. Seen as originator of social services in Peru.



St. Bartholomew (1st century) August 24th Apostle, preached in India and Armenia. Martyred in Derbend on the Caspian Sea. Patron saint of all those who work with skins i.e. tanners and furriers

St. Louis, King of France XI. August 25th He was born in 1214. At the age of twelve he lost his father, and his mother became regent of the kingdom. From his tenderest infancy she had inspired him with a love for holy things. In 1234, he married Margaret, and in 1236 he reigned in his own

right. In 1238, he headed a crusade, in which he fell a prisoner among the Mohammedans, but a truce was concluded and he was set free and he returned to France. In 1267, he again set out for the East at the head of a crusade but he never again beheld his native land. In 1270, he was stricken by the pestilence at the siege of Tunis, and after receiving the Last Sacraments, he died. His feast day is August 25th. He made numerous judicial and legislative reforms. Promoted Christianity in France; established religious foundations, aided mendicant orders, propagated synodal decrees of the Church, built leper hospitals, and collected relics. Led two Crusades and died on one

St. Monica, 332-387 August 27th Converted her pagan husband, Patricius, to the faith, and by her prayers and tears brought her son, St. Augustine, to Christianity and a moral life. Patron saint of Mothers..



The [International Day in Remembrance of Slavery and its Abolition](#) on 23 August commemorates in the first place the

successful slave revolt against French colonialists in what became Haiti. (1791-1804), This was part of a more general reaction against slavery in Europe, often inspired by the growing belief in universal human rights. That belief undermined the basis of slavery. The early Christians, too, took slavery for granted. We hear little of Christian slaves, though the entire households that became Christian would certainly have included slaves. Christians were instructed to treat their slaves well, and slaves to obey their masters. Christianity at its best diminished the gulf between slaves and those who owned them, but did not abolish the inhumanity of it.

After slavery was gradually replaced by other forms of service, it returned when Europeans made their way to Africa and to the Americas. It became profitable as African traders captured slaves and sent them to markets that despatched them to the New World to work in agriculture and mines in exchange for goods from Europe. Catholic Bishops generally appealed for their humane treatment, and insisted that they were fully human. But few questioned the institution of slavery.
