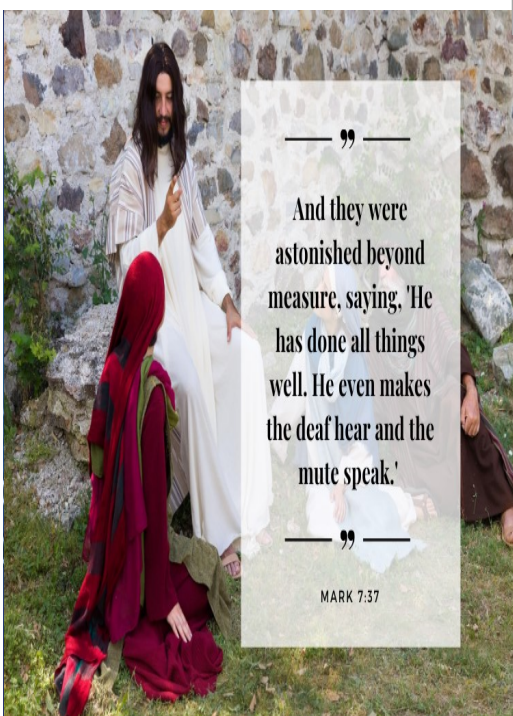

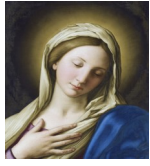

**St Peter Claver  
9th September.**

Went to South America ordained in 1615 and preached to the Slaves and worked with. The slave trade thrived in South America despite condemnation for Pope Paul III and Pius IV. Peter died from a disease that he caught while doing his pastoral work. He was Canonized by Pope Leo XIII 1888
