St. Dominic, 1170-1221 August 8th
A Spaniard who founded the Order of Preachers to counteract the Albigensian heresy. The Dominican Order were first established in Athenry in 1241 and in Galway 1488 they have had an unbroken link with the city every since and through very difficult times.

Edith Stein, St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, 1891-1942 August 9th Born

in Breslau, Germany, murdered in the Nazi death camp of Auschwitz, Poland, Edith Stein dedicated her life to a pursuit of truth leading from her roots in Judaism, via adolescent agnosticism, to the study of philosophy, to Catholicism and ultimately to life as a Carmelite. Europe not only has male patron saints, but also now three holy women: Edith Stein, Catherine of Sienna, and Bridget of Sweden. These holy women are examples and intercessors along with Saint Benedict, Saint Cyril, and Saint Methodius.

St Nathy Patron of the Diocese of Achroiny. The diocese covers Eastern part of Mayo and West Sligo.

St Felim Patron of the Diocese of Kilmore. The Diocese covers most of Cavan, northern Leitrim and southern Fermanagh.

St. Lawrence, d. 258 August 10th

Is seen as the cheerful giver since he was one of the seven deacons of the Roman Church in charge of the material needs of the faithful. Gifted with a sense of humour, he met his death cheerfully on a gridiron. Patron saint of the poor and cooks.

St Clare August 11th

Born in Assisi 1193. She followed St Francis into poverty and founded the Poor Clares when Francis finished his church in Assisi he gave a house to Clare to start a convent. The convents were harsh and the rule of poverty was strict. The convents spread to the rest of Europe. She died 1253 and was canonized by Pope Alexander IV 1255.

St. Muireadach Patron of the diocese of Killala August 12th

Was probably the founder of the church at Killala. He may also be the founder and patron of the monastery of Inishmurray off the Sligo coast. The Diocese covers the north and west of Mayo and Northwest Sligo

St. Attracta August 12th Dates to the 6th or 7th centuries. Local tradition remembers her great healing powers. Her convents were famous for hospitality and charity to the poor.

St. Lelia August 12th Had a church at Kileely, near Thomand Bridge. She is said to have been baptised by St. Patrick.
