

Saints of the week

St. Bridget of Sweden 23rd Born c. 1303, died 23rd July 1373, is the patron saint of Sweden. She was lady in waiting at the royal court until her husband died in 1344. She founded the double order of monks and nuns, known as the Bridgettines, , following one of her many visions and revelations. She travelled extensively in the cause of Christian unity





St. Charbel 24th July Born in 1828 Joseph Makhlouf at Bega-Kafra, Lebanon. His peasant family lived a strong faith. At the age of twenty-three, Charbel (the name he chose when entering the monastery) he enter the Lebanese-Maronite Monastery. Following studies and profession he was ordained in 1859. For the next seven years, Charbel lived in the mountainous community of d'Anaya. After that he spent the next twenty-three years in complete

solitude at Sts. Peter and Paul Hemitage near d'Anaya. He died there on Christmas Eve, 1898. Charbel lived a life of austerity, penances, obedience,

and chastity. He was beatified in 1965 and canonized in 1977 by Pope Paul VI.,



.St. James Thursday 25th Son of Zebedee and brother of John, called the Greater. He was out to death by Herod Agrippa about the year 44, being the first of the Apostles to die for Christ. His shrine is at Compostella in Spainminers, cabinet makers. and home makers

Sts. Joachim and Anne. Friday 26th Traditionally named parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary. St. Anne.

St. Martha c. 1st Century AD July29th Sister of Lazarus and Mary, is a woman of faith who made her profession of faith in Christ as the Son of God, and in the resurrection. Patron of innkeepers, cooks and dieticians.
