The readings for the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A are a call to love. The first reading tells how we are to treat other people, especially the poor, oppressed, and marginalized.

The second reading reminds us that how we live should show that we are followers of Jesus.

And in the gospel Jesus gives us the Great Commandment and the Golden Rule. loving God and loving your neighbour. This lesson plan asks what love really is and presents questions for contemplation.

Both the Gospel and the reflection emphasize that love is not just a feeling, but also an action. They both suggest that genuine love for God manifests in love for others. By questioning how we demonstrate love, the reflection offers a way to gauge if we're truly following the core teachings. It acts as a practical guide to understand and embody these key commandments.

Saints of the Week

 1^{st} All Saints The feast is of Celtic origin and was celebrated 20^{th} April in Ireland. Later the date moved to 1^{st} of November. In Europe the feast was celebrated on 13^{th} May and in the Eastern Churches the first Sunday after Pentecost.

2nd Nov. All Souls The feast was celebrated in the Monasteries to commemorate the dead outside of their anniversaries. It later spread to the universal Church. The Dominicans started the celebration of three mass on the day for the deceased. In 1915 Pope Benedict XV extended this to the whole Church, this was done in the shadow of WWI and

3rd St Malachy. Patron Saint of Archdiocese of Armagh and Diocese Down and Connor A native of Armagh, Malachy first became Bishop of Connor and later archbishop of Armagh, from which he lead the reform of the Irish Church. Later he retired to the

rom which he lead the ater he retired to the lairvaux in the year 1148 while on a mission to

dioceses of Down. He died at Clairvaux in the year 1148 while on a mission to the pope. He was buried there in front of the high altar and five years later

St Bernard was buried in the same grave.




St Martin de Porres Born in Lima Peru, father was Spanish and mother was a freed slave. He received a Christian education and became a pharmacist. He entered the Dominican order, as a brother, and was assigned to the infirmary. His work was among the poor and the sick and was his reputation grew because of his good work.

4th Saint Charles Borro-

meo. Born in Lombardy in 1538. after obtaining his doctorate in both Canon and Civil law he was created a Cardinal by Pope Pius IV and was chosen as bishop of Milan. He became a true pastor of his people and frequently visited around his diocese, called reforming synods and made wise regulation for the good of his people

Halloween or Hallowe'en (less commonly known as All Halloween, All Hallows' Eve, or All Saints' Eve is a celebration observed in many countries on 31 October, the eve of the Western Christian feast of All Saints' Day. It begins the observance of All Hallowtide the time in the liturgical year dedicated to remembering the dead, including saints (hallows), martyrs, and all the faithful departed Some people practice the Christian observances of All Hallows' Eve, including attending church services and lighting candles on the graves of the dead
