

Pope Francis releases his message for the **Gist World Day of Prayer for Vocations**, and urges Christians to welcome our shared vocation to sow the seeds of hope and peace in our world. The Holy Father noted that all Christians are called to welcome our God-given vocation to serve Him in the world, whether it be through the consecrated life, the priesthood, marriage, or even as a single person.

Gratitude, he said, should characterize World Vocations Day celebrations, as we recall the countless Christians who serve God in all walks of life. He especially invited young people to make room for God, so that they might find happiness in His call, which always respects our freedom. "Let Jesus draw you to Himself," said the Pope. "Bring Him your important questions by reading the Gospels; let Him challenge you by His presence, which always provokes in us a healthy crisis." ", we are called to listen to one another and to journey together in order to acknowledge them

and to Discern where the Spirit is leading us for the benefit of all."

The Pope also urged everyone to pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life, so that the Lord may "send out labourers into His harvest."

As the Church prepares for the Jubilee with a Year of Prayer, Christians should engage daily in a prayer that listens for the voice of God and helps us become "pilgrims of hope and builders of peace



## Saints of the Week

21<sup>st</sup>St Anselm Piedmont Italy, he entered the Benedictian Monastery in Asto Italy, but under pressure form his father he left and after a difficult period of time as a young man he fled to France and entered a monastery Bec, France. He later became the abbot, his reputation for preaching grew, and he also reformed the monastery. He wrote many great works of theology during this period. He was appointed

as archbishop of Canterbury, he had to go into exile on two occasions because of disputes between Rome and London. He died in 1109.

23<sup>rd</sup>. St George. Died as a martyr in Palistine he is honoured in both the Eastern (Greek and Russian Orthodox) and Western Church (Roman Catholic). The knowledge of the saint reached England in 7<sup>th</sup> Cent. But the popularity of the saint reached new heights because of the crusades. Richard the lion heart put his army under the protection of



George, before the battle, which the English army was victorious. The Saint was again connected with an English

Victory when at the battle of Agincourt. During Henry V speech he invoked George. He was venerated as patron of England. During the Reformation his popularity diminished and



devotion to him was discouraged. 23<sup>rd</sup> April St Adalbert of Prague Adalbert, bishop and martyr, born 956, after being bishop of Prague, went as a missionary among the Prussians on the Polish coast where he was martyred in 997.

### 24<sup>th</sup> April. St Fidelis

Franciscan Capuchin martyr. He was born Mark Rey is Sigmaringen, Germany, in 1577. A practicing lawyer, he traveled across Europe as a tutor to aristocrats but then started defending the poor. In 1612, he became a Franciscan Capuchin monk, taking the name of Fidelis. A missionary to the





Calvinists in Switzerland, Fidelis was stabbed to death. He was canonized by Pope Benedict 14th 1746.

25th St. Mark Was closely connected with the preaching of Sts Peter, Paul and Barnabas. His Gospel was probably written in Rome when he was with Paul, and is traditionally viewed as representing St. Peter's approach to the preaching of the good news. Later tradition has him as an interpreter for St. Peter. His symbol is

a winged lion.
