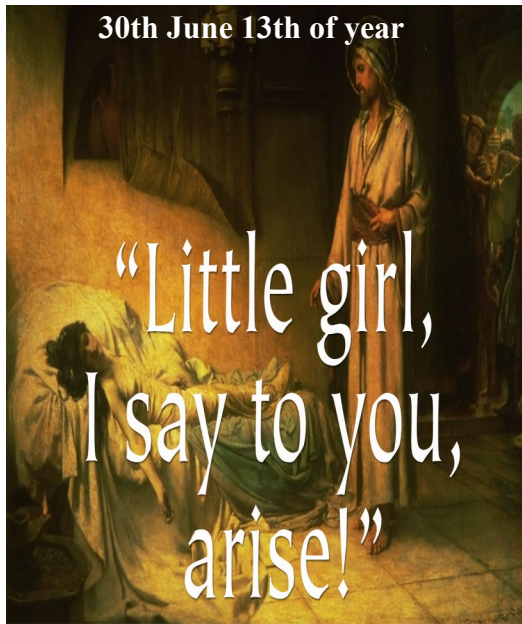

In the Gospel, Jesus does not accept death as the final say. In fact, he ignores the report of the death of the little girl and, inviting the parents to have faith, he calls the girl back to life. But his care is not over. He goes even further in showing his desire for a good life for her, inviting the parents to give her something to eat, presuming that she would be hungry, and food is a sign of normalcy and comfort. Having food to eat is a sign of a good life, something that all of us are entitled to by being created with the dignity of the children of God. Even on his way to Jairus' house, Jesus had restored the woman who touched his clothes to her own dignity of being freed from her illness, which the text says lasted for twelve long years. Jesus's mission is giving life, restoring life.

Saints of the Week

St. Oliver Plunkett bishop and martyr 1625-81 July 1st

He was ordained a priest in 1654, in 1669 he was appointed archbishop of Armagh. Oliver was one of only two Catholic bishops in Ireland at that time. He was accused of high treason in 1678 and hanged in 1681. He was canonized in 1976.

St. Thomas July 3rd

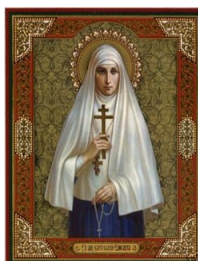
Is said to have preached the gospel in India where he was martyred. The faith that led him to know Christ in his wounds also sent him to the farthest places to preach. Patron of Architects.



St. Elizabeth of Portugal, 1271-1336

July 4th

From the house of Aragon had an unhappy marriage with the King of Portugal. She persevered in prayer and good works, and as a widow lived in poverty as a Franciscan Tertiary.



St Anthony Maria Zaccaria, 1502-1539 July 5th

Was first a medical doctor before becoming a priest in

Milan. He founded the Barnabites.

St. Moninne of Killeavy July 5th

Was one of Ireland's early women saints. A priest instructed her in the principles of religious life, and eight virgins and a widow with a baby became a community under her Rule at Sliabh Gullion, Co. Armagh. They led an eremitical life on the mountain, based on that of Elijah and John the Baptist. She died in 517/18.

St. Maria Goretti, 1890 - 1902, July 6th

Stabbed to death in defence of her virtue

St Maelruain July 7th

Bishop and Abbot founded the monastery at Tallagh Co Dublin in 774 which introduced reforms to the Irish Monastic system
