St. Stephen of Hungary 975-1038 August 16th First king of Hungary, and its patron saint, worked for the conversion of is people to

Christianity. **Dur Lady of Knock** August 17th The story of Knock began on the 21 August 1879when Our Lady, St Joseph and St John the Evangelist appeared at the south gable



of Knock Parish Church. This miraculous apparition was witnessed by fifteen people, young and old. Knock is an internationally recognised Marian Shrine. Saint John Paul 11

visited Knock as part of his 1979 papal pilgrimage to Ireland. Pope Francis went to Knock and prayed at the Shrine before the final Mass of the World Meeting of Families at the Phoenix Park, Dublin on Sunday 26 August 2018. The date of the memorial is within the annual novena conducted at the Shrine.

Pope Francis, on the Feast of Joseph 19 March 2021, declared Knock to be an International Shrine of Eucharistic and Marian Devotion



St. John Eudes. August 19th 1601-1680, from Normandy, France, spent a fruitful 20 years with the French Oratory, then left to found a congregation to improve the standards of the clergy through seminaries. He was among the first to promote devotion to the Sacred Heart.

St. Bernard b. 1090, d. August 20, 1153 Became a Cistercian monk at

Citeaux in 1113 and was chosen abbot of Clairvaux in 1115. His writings reveal a solid grasp of biblical studies, spiritual theology, and philosophy. Patron of Gibralter and bee-keepers.





St. Pius X, 1835–1914, August 21st Cardinal Patriarch of Venice, then Pope from 1903. Encouraged pastoral

liturgy, and sacramental practice, condemned Modernism.

St. Eugene Patron of the diocese of Derry. August 23rd 6th cent. Was the founder of the monastery of Ardstraw, County Tyrone. He was said

to have been taken by pirates to Britain. On obtaining his freedom he went to study at Candida Casa. Returning to Ireland he founded Kilnamanagh Monastery in the Wicklow



hills, but his principal monastery was at Ardstraw. The Cathedral in Derry is named after him. The diocese covers the most of Derry and Tyrone and the Inishowen peninsula.

St. Rose of Lima, 1586-1617, August 23rd Dominican tertiary and recluse, helped the poor and marginalised. Seen as originator of social services in Peru.


