

Jesus was doing just that in this reading: preparing a table in the desert, producing plenty, and more than plenty, in the place of utmost

scarcity. But how did he do it? St John Chrysostom (c. 349-407 AD) wrote: "Observe the wisdom of the Master; he did not say to them, I will give them something to eat,' but, 'you give them something to eat.'" He accepted their meagre contribution, he did not set their gift aside, but used it. Another ancient writer said, "He created no

alternative food; he took what they had and gave thanks." He allowed the bounty to appear to come from themselves.

The gift of God does not displace us from our lives; it does not take over from us and make our effort redundant. On the contrary, it is in the throes of our efforts that the gift of God appears.

Saints of the week



St John Vianney 1786—1859 4th August.Born in Lyons 1786. he was not academically bright, his ordination did not take place until he was 29 and was appointed PP in Ars he administered to the people for 42 years the bishop tried to move him and each time the people refused to let him go. He was an excellent confessor. He was awarded the Legion of Honour in 1843 and sold it to give the money to the poor. He is patron of diocesan priests

The Transfiguration of the Lord 6th August


Pope St. Sixtus II August 7th Pope St. Sixtus and his four deacon companions were put to death in 258




St. Cajetan, 1480-1547 August 7th

Edith Stein, St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, 1891–1942 August 9th Born in Breslau, Germany, murdered in the Nazi death camp of Auschwitz, Poland, Edith Stein dedicated her life to a pursuit of truth leading from her roots in Judaism, via adolescent agnosticism, to the study of philosophy, to Catholicism and ultimately to life as a Carmelite. Europe not only has male patron saints, but also now three holy women: Edith Stein, Catherine of Sienna, and Bridget of Sweden. These holy women are examples

and intercessors along with Saint Benedict, Saint Cyril, and Saint

St Nathy Patron of the Diocese of Achrony. The diocese covers Eastern part of Mayo and West Sligo.

St. Colman's Grotto or "Leaba Mhic

Duagh," (His Cave) has remained perfectly preserved for more than fourteen hundred years and is situated on a steep elevation about 30 ft. above the oratory. It is about 15 ft. long, by 4 or 5 at its greatest width. A tall man with ease can stand erect within it.

St. Colman constructed a small oratory at the base of the tall cliff of "Ceanaille." In fact to this day there still are the remains of this oratory and the cave close to his oratory in which he sought shelter and rest. A crystal fountain supplied him with drink. The wild herbs of the forest were his only food, and the skins of the wild deer formed his coarse clothing. Here shut out from all human converse, and dead to all earthly things, St. Colman led a life of the highest spirituality. Through his seemingly continual fasts, prayers and vigils he became so imbued with a sense of the Divine love that he was frequently wrapped in ecstasy, and enjoyed the most abundant spiritual consolations.
