In his October prayer intention for a shared mission, Pope Francis is asking us all to relate to one another as family

WALKING TOGETHER Pope Francis calls it a synodal lifestyle. Synodal means walking together,

sharing the same home, the same responsibilities and being part of the same conversations. It means not turning the home into a series of separate flats, not eating separately, not speaking only when invited to, not locking the door to keep visitors away. In the Church it means meeting one another as companions, each responsible for the Church in different ways, and talking together about what we should do and how Jesus would want us to live. Synodal is the opposite of bossy, excluding, clericalist, isolating, insisting on having the first and the last word or putting on airs. In a family, it means that everybody, and not just the children, naturally say please, thank you and sorry as needed. In conversation it means that no one begins by saying, I've got an answer, have you got a question, but all come as searchers together. In looking for the right path to follow, it means careful listening and paying attention to people, ready to learn as well as to teach in discerning God's will. If we do relate to one another in this way, we shall translate the large words of participation, communion and mission of the Church into simple actions.



## Saints of the Week

5th October St Faustina Born the third of ten children in Poland. She worked as a domestic servant until she joined the sisters of Our Lady of Mercy. During her 13 years in the convent she fulfilled many different roles in the houses that she served. She had deep devotion to the Blessed Sacrament, to reconciliation and to Our Lady. She had a number of visions and mystical experiences and wrote of these experiences in a journal. She was

asked to promote the mercy of God to each sinner. She died in 1938, when Karol Wojtyla was made Archbishop of Cracow he under took her cause. Beatified April 1993 Canonized April 2000



## 7<sup>th</sup> October Our Lady of Rosery 9th October Sts. Denis. Rusticus and Eleutherius

They were beheaded and thrown into the Seine in 258 and later buried at Montmartre. Denis, the first Bishop of Paris, is one of the patrons of France.

9<sup>th</sup> October Bl John Henry Newman John Henry Newman, the 19th century's

most important English-speaking Roman Catholic theologian, spent the first half of his life as an Anglican and the second half as a Roman Catholic. He was a priest, popular preacher, writer and eminent theologian in both Churches. Born in London, England, he studied at Oxford's Trinity College, was a tutor at Oriel



College and for 17 years was vicar of the university church, St. Mary the Virgin. He eventually published eight volumes of *Parochial and Plain Sermons* as well as two novels. His poem, "Dream of Gerontius," was set to music by Sir Edward Elgar. After 1833, Newman was a prominent member of the Oxford Movement, which emphasized the Church's debt to the Church Fathers and challenged any tendency to consider truth as completely subjective. Historical research made Newman suspect that the Roman Catholic Church was in closest continuity with the Church that Jesus established. In 1845, he was received into full communion as a Catholic. Two years later he was ordained a Catholic priest in Rome and joined the Congregation of the Oratory, founded three centuries earlier by St. Philip Neri. Returning to England, Newman founded Oratory houses in Birmingham and London and for seven years served as rector of the Catholic University of Ireland. Pope Benedict XVI beatified Newman on September 19, 2010, at Crofton Park (near Birmingham). The pope noted Newman's emphasis on the vital place of revealed religion in civilized society but also praised his pastoral zeal for the sick, the

poor, the bereaved and those in prison.

9th October St. John Leonardi, 1541-1609

Supported the reforms of Trent, published a catechism, helped to found the Propagation of the Faith in Rome.


11th October St. Canice

Was born in C. Derry around 527 and died in 603. Though his people were poor he studied at

Clonard under Finnian and at Glasnevin under Mobhi. A deep friendship developed between himself and Colum Cille, with whom he worked for a time in Scotland, where he set up a number of churches.

When God puts something together, man has no business changing it or breaking it apart. This principle is used by Christ in Matthew 19:6 when the Jews ouizzed Christ about marriage and divorce. So they are no longer two but one flesh. What therefore God has joined together, let not man separate.
